What Sparked World War I?

How did it start?

There was conflict in Europe with balance of power among the alliance countries.

The spark in 1914 was the assassination of Arch Duke Ferdinand of Austria - Hungary

When and Why did the U.S.A. get involved?

The U.S.A. was supporting Great Britain's war effort by sending weapons and supplies.

Germany was tried to block the U.S. effort.

After the sinking of the passenger liner the R.M.S Lusitania and the German threat to U.S. shipping lanes the U.S. entered the war in 1917.

The President at the time was Woodrow Wilson

Military Improvements

During WWI the use of chemical weapons was common. They were not effective because armies could guard against these weapons and they were hard to control

- machine guns

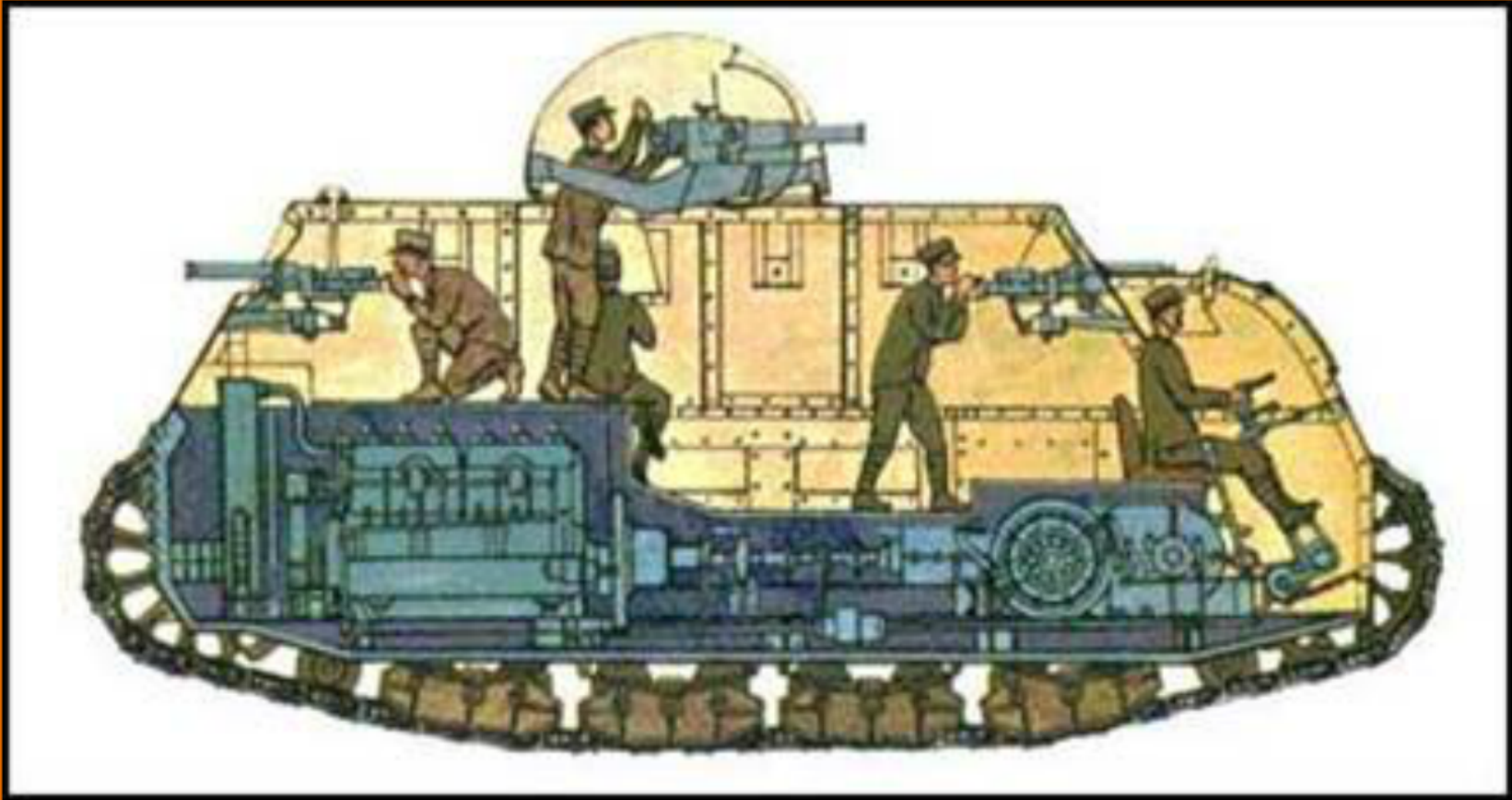

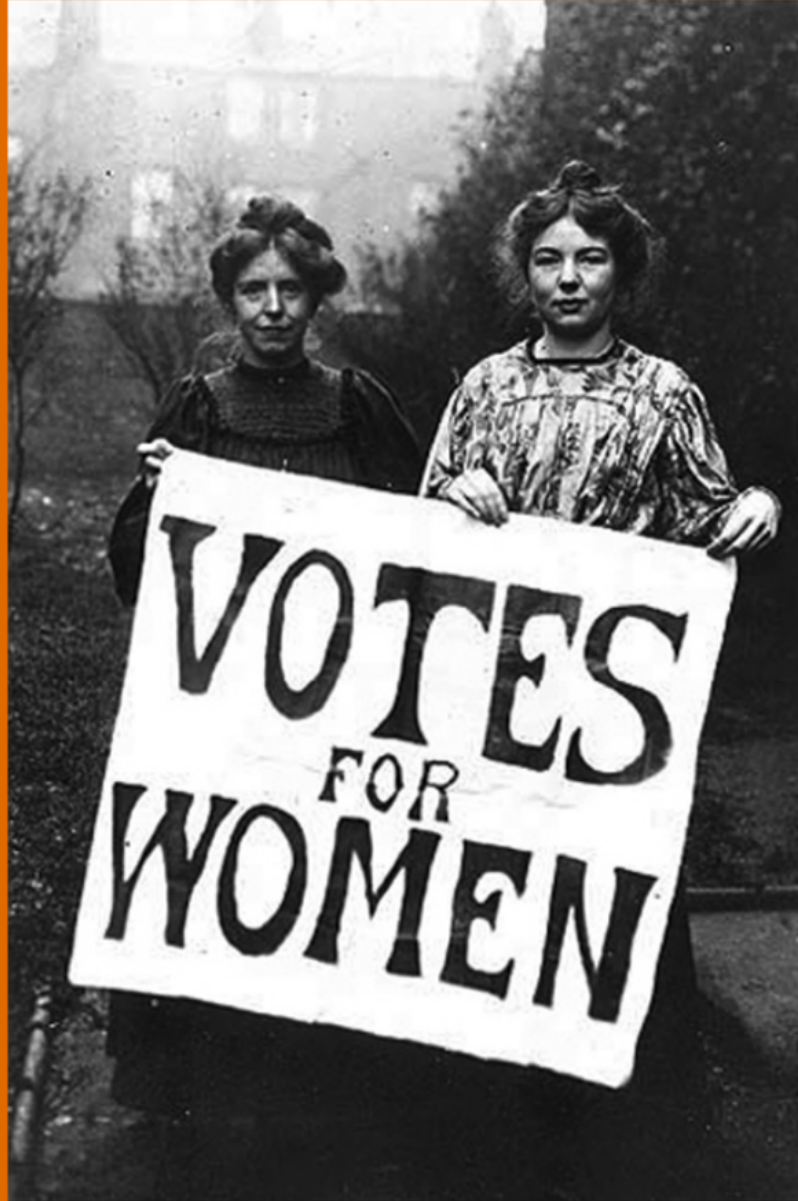






When did the war end?

The war ended in 1918 with the signing of the Treaty of Versailles. The treaty created new borders in Europe and forced Germany to take blame for the war.
